%World Meat Production 2009




FIGURE 1 WORLD'S MEAT PRODUCTION 2009 (WWW.FAO.ORG)

In 2009, 62.8 million tonnes of beef were produced by 202 countries across the World. Of these, 132 countries produced less than 100,000 tonnes and 11 countries produced more than 1,000,000 tonnes (Table 1). The 11 countries that produced more than 1,000,000 tonnes were responsible for 65.6% of the total produced (www.fao.org and faostat.fao.org). Britain produced 849,860 tonnes in 2009.




Figure 2), the United States of America, European Union, Brazil and China being the four main trading units. Although the production from the Rest of The World is substantial, it is a compound figure representing many countries that do not function as trading units.




FIGURE 2: WORLD'S BEEF TONNAGE PRODUCTION

Brazil, China and the Rest of the World are responsible for the highest tonnage increase (Table 2). There was a decrease in production in the European Union and United States of America. China is responsible for 19.3%, Rest of the World 39.5% and Brazil for 42.9% of the increase across the World.




FIGURE 3: DISTRIBUTION OF THE WORLD'S BEEF PRODUCTION 2009




FIGURE 4: DISTRIBUTION OF THE WORLD'S BEEF PRODUCTION 2000




FIGURE 5 IMPORTS AND EXPORTS BALANCE

The main beef exporters in the world are Brazil, Australia and Argentina. China is more or less self sufficient, the European Union imports some meat while the Russian Federation, United States of America, Africa, South East Asia and the Rest of the World are substantial beef importers. Despite being a major beef producer the United States is also a significant beef importer.




FIGURE 6 IMPORTS AND EXPORTS 2009




FIGURE 7 EUROPEAN UNION BEEF PRODUCTION
