KEY REASONS FOR MANAGING BODY CONDITION

Aim is to ensure cows:

- · are not too fat at calving
- produce as much milk as possible
- are fit enough to get back in calf quickly
- put on weight and condition when the cheapest feed is available (usually grazed grass)
- use body condition to reduce expensive feeding costs (especially in winter)
