



Activity title:	1. The Kardomah Gang - who would you choose?
Description:	Discussion - who would you choose as your guests in the café?
Year groups:	KS2

Equipment required:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Kardomah Gang PowerPoint presentation (KS2_Activity1_KardomahPowerpoint)
Suggested procedure:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Show the PowerPoint presentation to the learners revising, if necessary, who Dylan Thomas was.• Have a class discussion regarding famous people in modern times, encouraging them to think of famous people in a range of different fields. They could be writers, artists, pop stars, sports stars, celebrities etc.• Split the class into small groups. The groups should then choose five famous people to be in their 'gang', choosing individuals from a variety of areas.• Learners could then present as a group which individuals they have chosen and why.



Extension activities:	Learners could create three questions they would like to ask each of their guests. Learners could choose 1 of their guests and present an argument to the rest of the class as to why that person should be invited using persuasive language.
