Drama and Performing Arts – Listening comprehension and Discussion of the qualities needed to be a performer

Adrian Metcalfe is an actor who performs a show about Dylan Thomas. Watch the clip where he gives budding actors some advice. Then, answer the questions below: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Oiir2k0WKfk

- 1. What advice does Adrian Metcalfe give an actor/performer?
- 2. Watch again the section of Adrian Metcalfe performing. What other tips can you pick up from **watching** his performance?

Discussion points:

- 1. What general qualities do you need to be a performer?
- 2. Adrian Metcalfe performs a show about Dylan Thomas in pubs. Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of performing in pubs as opposed to performing in a theatre.
- 3. Is there an important literary /historical figure or sportsperson in your area who could form the basis of a show or play? Discuss your ideas.
