

A Refusal to Mourn the Death, by Fire, of a Child in London

Lesson 3

Overview

- Look in detail at last two stanzas of poem
- Start consolidating understanding of the whole of the poem

Suggested procedure

- 1. Review Lessons 1 and 2, spending some time on recapping the final questions of Lesson 2.
- 2. Look at Stanza 3, from the second line, with the Teacher Notes as a guide. The following questions may prove useful for pair/group work to confirm understanding (Resource sheet/PowerPoint presentation, Lesson 3 Task 1):
 - 1. Why does the poet use the phrase I shall not murder...?
 - 2. Which word from Stanza 1 is repeated in Stanza 3? Do you think this is important? If so why?/ If not why not?
 - 3. What two meanings does a grave truth have?
 - 4. What are the stations of the breath?
 - 5. What is an elegy?

How has this Stanza contributed to learners' understanding of the poem?

- 3. Continue by looking at Stanza 4 with the class. Again, the following questions may be used for pair work to supplement your explanation (Resource sheet/Powerpoint presentation, Lesson 3 Task 2):
 - 1. Why is the child referred to as London's daughter?
 - 2. Where has the child been buried?
 - 3. What or who are the long friends?
 - 4. What do the Thames and Dylan Thomas have in common?



- 5. What does the riding Thames suggest to you?
- 6. What does the final sentence mean?
- 4. Use the following questions (Resource sheet/PowerPoint presentation, Lesson 3 Task 3) to start consolidating understanding of the whole of the poem. These can be discussed as a class and then learners can note their answers individually as a record of the discussion:
 - 1. What is 'A Refusal to Mourn . . .' about?
 - 2. What does Dylan Thomas say in the first full sentence of the poem?
 - 3. What does he say in Stanza 3 about his refusal to mourn?
 - 4. What does the poet describe in the first five lines of Stanza 4?
 - 5. What does the poet say in the final sentence?
