

A Refusal to Mourn the Death, by Fire, of a Child in London

Lesson 6

Overview

Discussion of themes and bringing together of relevant points.

Suggested procedure

- 1. Introduce the lesson's objective.
- 2. Before asking learners to consider Task 1, which asks learners to give a personal response to the poem, it may be useful to have a general class discussion about what they liked/disliked, what they find accessible or difficult, the poem's strengths and weaknesses, how they respond to the main theme, which images they consider to be most effective etc.
- 3. Introduce Task 2:
 - 1. As a class, consider what the main themes of this poem are.
 - 2. Which of these themes is the most important, in your opinion? *Main themes: death, war, grief. Most important: death.*
- 4. Use Slide 4 and 5 of the Presentation as a general introduction to the theme of death in Dylan Thomas's work.
- 5. Task 3 will require preparation and guidance before learners complete the grid.
- 6. Conclude with a class discussion of Task 3.
- 7. Additional activities could include looking at another poem about the death of a child from the myriad of examples available on the internet, by known and unknown poets.
