Unit 12: Mastitis Teacher's notes

Introduction

Mastitis is one of the 3 main causes for culling cows. It is the inflammation of the teat canal and the udder.

This inflammation is usually caused by pathogens. In sheep there is usually a mechanical pre-disposing factor e.g.

- the older lamb butting and causing bruising of the udder
- the lamb's teeth scratching the surface of the teat.

This session deals with the main causes, prevention and treatment of mastitis.
